    - New Source capture exhaust system
      - Not possible to gather estimate in time.
  - Vehicle Acquisition
    - Pumper & Tanker are eligible.
    - Older vehicles are a priority.
  - Regional Projects

- Discussed grant options.
  - Officer would like to pursue grants for hose/nozzle packages and gear dryer/extractor.
- Minimum Training Requirements (Decision #1)
  - Suggested that there be a minimum training requirement for all members to be considered active.
    - Quarterly requirements (Calendar quarter)
      - In person or Fire Rescue 1
        - 4.5 Hours a quarter for SAR
        - 9 Hours a quarter for Fire & FIRE/SAR
  - Affective once a computer is set up for members to use at the firehouse.
    - Tim working on getting his set up/
  - Outside Training not permitted if in-house training minimum requirements are NOT met.

- Grandfathering of Driver/Operators (Decision #2)
  - Looking for guidance on how long to grandfather driver qualifications for members who have not completed online training.
    - Decision by officers
      - If someone has several years on the department and has been approved to drive/operator vehicles, retraining on equipment of any kind will be unnecessary.
        - With the following exceptions.
          - Being brand new apparatus, everyone will need to be trained on it
          - If a member left the department for an extended period of time with no activity
          - All above exceptions can be overridden by the Incident Commander based on the situation.
- ATV & Snowmobile Check Rides (Decision #3)
  - State Safety Course waived unless born after 07/01/1983.
    - Recommended for all but not needed if birth prior to date.
      - Especially recommended for those with no prior knowledge or use.
  - $\circ$  Approval of operators based on 02/07/2024 training and check rides.
    - ATV/Snowmobile
      - Mike A., Tamera Allen, March Balch, Chris Perrone, Eric St.Denis, Marco Tallini, Luca Villani, Chris Weyant, Mike Yeachshein, Ryan Hescock
      - All of the above approved by the officers.
